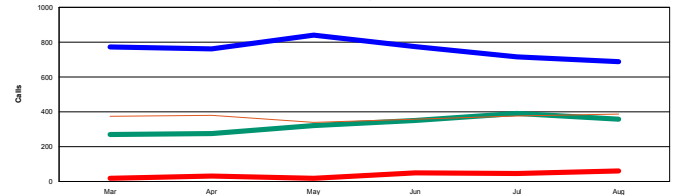
Arrests by Month

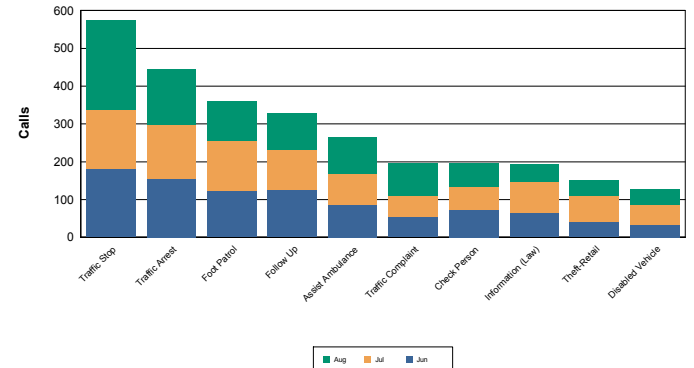

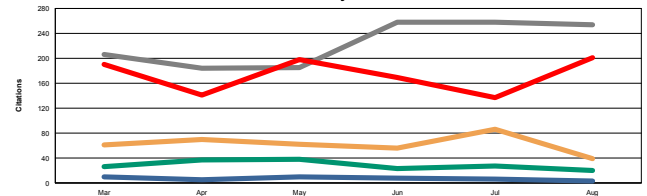

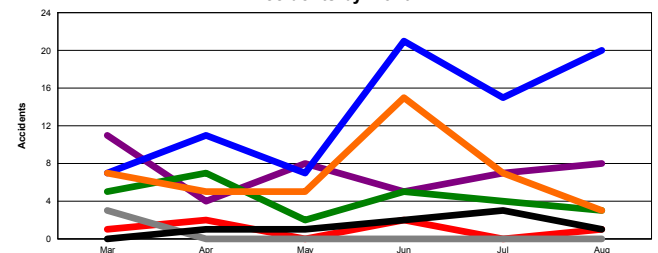

## **OPERATIONS DIVISION**

In August of 2019, the Operations Division handled 36 vehicle crashes and issued 201 traffic warnings, 254 traffic citations, and 20 parking tickets. Our calls total for August was 1,493 calls for service.

### **Training**

In August all Officers attended an 8 Hour In-Service which covered the Middleton Shooting, Journey Mental Health, Taser Recertification and Firearms training.

### **Speed Trailer**

### **Security Checks**

Officers performed 106 security checks in the month of August. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

### **Retail Thefts**

There were 41 retail theft cases in August, down from the unusually high 68 we had in July. Around 40 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

### **Tellurian Treatment Center**

In August we had 14 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 22.5 hours of police time.

### **Use of Force Incidents**

On August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 1:08 am Monona Police Officers were dispatched to assist Madison PD on a shots fired call where the shooter was in a car headed south on HWY 51. Our Officers observed the suspect vehicle and made a High Risk traffic stop with their handguns drawn and secured the driver and two occupants. Officers from Fitchburg handled the investigation as that is where the incident initiated. (MO19-010282)

On August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 3:40 am Monona Police Officers were dispatched to Wal-Mart for a retail theft in progress. The suspect was visually identified as a felony theft offender

who we recently arrested at our Wal-Mart. The suspect fled at high speeds with over \$1600 in merchandise. The suspect was arrested on August 9<sup>th</sup> after committing a retail theft at a Madison Wal-Mart and charges were forwarded on our multiple felony incident. (MO19-010426)

On August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 9:46 pm a Monona Officer attempted to pull over a suspected drunk driver. The driver fled at high speeds and the pursuit was terminated per policy. (MO19-010523)

On August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 1:36 am Monona Police Officers were dispatched to Wal-Mart for a retail theft in progress. The four suspects had arrived in a stolen vehicle, so mutual aid was requested to form a perimeter on the parking lot. As expected, when the suspects observed police they attempted to flee on foot and were each apprehended with decentralization due to struggling to get away. (MO19-011266)

### **Citizen Complaints**

There were no citizen complaints in the month of August.

### **1<sup>st</sup> Shift**

On August 16<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 11:44 am, an Officer was dispatched to a Hit and Run crash on Monona Drive at Broadway. A Pick & Save employee called reporting the suspects were in their parking lot. As the Officer arrived she observed the suspects running across Broadway towards the Kwik Trip. One suspect was apprehended on scene. The Chief, the Lieutenant, both Detectives, and an Officer who had been working a traffic grant, checked the area for the other suspect. At 12:33 pm the officer observed the suspect about to get in a Green Cab in the parking lot of a salon. Store surveillance positively identified the suspects. The first male was cited for obstruction, and the second male was cited for obstruction and hit and run, then taken to the jail on a probation violation. (MO19-10806)

On August 20<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 9:13 am, an Officer responded to an illegal dumping complaint at the yard waste collection site. Two males got out of an SUV and dumped brush and wood out of the trailer even with multiple signs posted saying "NO BRUSH". The area has cameras and the plate was observed. The owner was contacted and stated the men were working for her, and she did not see the signs. The woman was a Madison resident and was informed she would be receiving a citation for illegal dumping (\$124) and also be liable for restitution for emptying the dumpster. (MO19-010895)

## **2nd Shift**

Here is the second shift activity report for the month of August 2019. Officers conducted 141 traffic stops, handled 20 Retail Thefts, and 21 crashes. We also made 4 OWI arrests.

The following are some of the cases second shift handled this month.

On August 7<sup>th</sup> Officers were dispatched to McDonalds on Broadway for a burglary. Upon arrival Officers were advised that the business was burglarized overnight. The suspect entered the business and left with an undisclosed amount of money. Surveillance video was obtained and this case is being investigated by the detective division.

On August 10<sup>th</sup> Officers were sent to the 6000 block of Gateway Green for a domestic disturbance. During the investigation Officers learned that the suspect struck the female victim, pulled her hair, and threw her to the ground. Some of these actions occurred in the driveway which was witnessed by a third party. An arrest was made and the suspect was transported to the Dane County Jail.

On August 10<sup>th</sup> Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Inland Way for a disturbance. An Uber driver called and advised that his passengers were intoxicated, belligerent and threw something at his vehicle. Apparently the passengers were upset that the vehicle they ordered was not big enough. During the complaining the Uber driver stated that he could let them out and they could order a bigger vehicle. The passengers refused and told the driver to keep driving. The passengers continued to be rude and then began swearing at the driver. At that point the driver pulled over and asked them to get out. Upon Police arrival the suspects continued to be foul mouthed and disrespectful. A citation was issued for Disorderly Conduct.

Also on August 10<sup>th</sup> Officers were sent to the McDonalds on Broadway for a subject passed out in his vehicle in the drive through. When Officers made contact with the suspect they found him passed out, foot on the brake, and an open bottle of champagne nearly empty between his legs. Officers were able to wake the suspect and speak to him. When the suspect was asked to step out of the vehicle the suspect attempted to drive away. The Officers were able to prevent that from occurring. After conducting field sobriety tests the suspect was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle while Intoxicated. During a search incident to arrest Officers located suspected heroin, suspected cocaine, and a firearm. The suspect was booked into the Dane County Jail for Felon in possession of a firearm, possession with intent to deliver cocaine, possession of heroin, and violation of parole.

### **3rd Shift**

The Monona Police Department third shift officers handled 7 retail thefts, 6 accidents, arrested 8 individuals with active arrest warrants, and responded to several disturbance calls during the month of August. Officers made 178 traffic stops resulting in 3 OWI arrest. Of those 178 traffic stops, 128 were given warnings, while 50 were issued citations.

On August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 at 12:46 a.m. officers responded to the 6100 block of Sylvan Lane for a hit and run accident. Officers observed the victim vehicle that had been struck and pushed into the lawn of a residence. Officers followed tire markings left on the roadway from the suspect vehicle to a residence on Ford Street, where it was located. Officers contacted the suspect at the residence who admitted to the accident. The suspect was intoxicated and placed under arrest for OWI 1<sup>st</sup> offense, with a B.A.C. of .17 g/210L.

On August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 3:40 a.m. officers responded to Wal-Mart for a felony retail theft. Officers arrived on scene as the suspect forced open an entrance near the tire center and got into a van. Officers attempted to apprehend the suspect but the van fled leading officers on a vehicle pursuit, which was terminated. Officers knew the identity of the suspect who had felony warrants out for his arrest. On August 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019 the suspect committed a retail theft in the City of Madison and was arrested. Monona officers responded and added on felony charges from this incident.

On August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 11:32 p.m. officers responded to a disturbance involving a knife on the 4300 block of Monona Drive. The investigation determined that a 12 year old daughter had attempted to stab her mother's fiancé during a disturbance at the residence. The fiancé did sustain a cut on his hand during the incident. Charges were referred on the juvenile to the Dane County courts.

On August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 1:41 a.m. officers responded to a vehicle accident on the 800 block of E. Broadway. Officers investigated and determined that the driver was traveling westbound on Broadway and told her boyfriend who was seated in the front passenger seat that she wanted to end their relationship. The boyfriend became upset, grabbed the steering wheel, steering the vehicle to the right causing it to crash. The boyfriend fled on foot and was not located. Charges were referred on the boyfriend to the Dane County District Attorney's office for 2<sup>nd</sup> degree reckless endangering safety and domestic disorderly conduct.

On August 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 2:47 a.m. a traffic stop was conducted on a vehicle for operating without any lights on during the hours of darkness. The operator was arrested for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup> offense, with a B.A.C. of .13g/210L.

On August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 1:31 a.m. officers responded to a retail theft at Wal-Mart. Officers were also advised that the vehicle that the suspects arrived in was stolen. Officers requested mutual aid from outside agencies as there were 4 suspects involved. Officers contacted the suspects when they were leaving the store. The suspects fled on

foot and were all captured. The suspects were charged with operating a motor vehicle without owner's consent and resisting arrest. The stolen vehicle was recovered and returned to the owner.

Members of the Investigative Unit were assigned to, or assisted with, the investigation of 17 current and past incidents.

### **Current Investigations**

#### **MO19-0XXXX – SEXUAL ASSAULT OF A CHILD**

A 13-year-old female reported multiple sexual encounters with her stepfather over the past one to two years. The suspect was arrested for repeated acts of sexual assault.

#### **MO19-10297 – FORGERY**

A local business had a person creating fake checks by using their business name and account without permission.

#### **MO19-11055 – BATTERY**

Detectives met with a potential victim to discuss a situation that the PD has been dealing with for quite some time. The person brought new potential evidence to detectives.

### **MO19-10593 – CHILD ABUSE**

A caller reported a minor injury to her child at a local day care. The mother was not satisfied with the explanation given by the daycare. The mother was referred to the Department of Children and Families to file a report against the day care provider to start the investigation.

### **MO19-10408 – BURGLARY**

A burglary occurred at McDonald's South this month during the closed overnight hours. The safe was entered and cash was taken. After an investigation by detectives, two suspects were developed and related charges have been referred to the Dane County DA Office.



### **MO19-10092 – STOLEN CAMPER**

A camper trailer was stolen that was worth over \$20k. It was eventually recovered abandoned in Portage, WI in a remote wooded area. Detectives followed up on leads and a suspect was developed. Related charges have been sent to the Dane County DA Office on this suspect who was homeless in the greater Madison area.

### **MO19-09281 – ID THEFT**

Credit cards of an elder victim were taken by an unknown person. The suspect was eventually identified after obtaining video. Detectives have referred 20 felony counts of ID Theft against the suspect.

### **MO19-11272 - THEFT**

This was a case where two adults lived together but when one moved out, she took the other's heirloom jewelry. Detectives found evidence of this and have referred charges against the suspect.



### **MO19-11392 – ORGANIZED CRIME**

Patrol arrested three subjects on a routine retail theft call. Detectives were called out and it was determined that they were Chilean Nationals involved with an interstate crime ring based out of California. Their vehicle was loaded with stolen merchandise. Detectives worked with ICE during this investigation. All three suspects were arrested and charged.

## **Citation and Arrest Statistics**

During the month of August, the Monona Police issued numerous traffic citations, municipal ordinance (non-traffic) citations, parking citations and warnings. In addition, there were many referrals for charges. See the detail below.

Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour and a half of the dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. In addition, Police staff must follow up by going to the DA's office to sign probable cause forms, as well as, review and electronically sign complaints to ensure the subjects are properly charged or held on charges.

## **Dispatch**

The Monona Communications Center answers business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center for dispatching of Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center advises Police of high priority Fire and EMS calls in the event Officer Response is required. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of August, Dispatchers handled 1,493 calls for service. Most of these calls for service were received on the non-emergency lines, via personal reporting at the Police Department, transfers from the Dane County Communications Center or as self-initiated calls directly from Monona Officers.
